

GPA Requirement for Continued Scholarship Funding

Question: If a student's cumulative college GPA falls below 2.75 at the end of a term, does the student forfeit the scholarship? Or, if after a semester or two or three, etc., the student brings up the GPA to 2.75 or above, will the scholarship be reinstated?

Effective August, 2011, the law provides for a one-time, one-term probationary period if a student's cumulative GPA falls below 2.75.

If at the end of a term, the cumulative GPA is below 2.75, the student will receive the scholarship payment for the next term.

If, at the end of the probationary term, the cumulative GPA is at least 2.75, the student will continue to receive scholarship payments. If the GPA falls below 2.75 at the conclusion of any term thereafter, the student is no longer eligible to receive any additional scholarship funds.

If, at the end of the probationary term, the cumulative GPA is not at least 2.75, the student is no longer eligible for scholarship funding.
